

SISTERS FIRST

My sister Kathy died ten years ago. I guess you never think about losing a sibling—you expect some day to bury your parent(s), and you fear ever losing your child—but you never think about losing a sister or brother, you always just expect them to be there. At least, that was my case, when my sister of just 45 died in her sleep of congestive heart failure.

I have three sisters, but Kathy was the one I had often fought with when we were kids. Actually, I have never even had a squabble with either of my two younger sisters, but Kathy and I were closest in age and we had grown up in our own little combat zone. Years later we did settle our differences—after we became *mothers*—and we became very close friends, but there had been a time when our fights were monumental and loud. I think of her a lot during the spring, because that was the season when I lost her.

Last year I attended the wake of PNP Susie Huffer. At her funeral were many of the older Blue Star Mothers in Ohio whom I fondly call the “Quarter Century Moms,” those BSMs who have been members of this Organization for 25 consecutive years or more. Sitting with them in the fellowship hall after the wake, I was struck with how much they *loved* each other, and how they spoke so kindly to each other. I made some remark about that, and they all laughed and told me, “It wasn’t *always* this way.” One of the QCMs said, “We used to fight like freshmen on the cheerleading squad.” “Really?” I asked, because there was no evidence of that in this setting. She responded, “Yes, but we long ago decided that we are Sisters first, and the fighting had to go.”

We have to learn a lesson from our Quarter Century Moms, if we are going to go the distance: we are sisters first.

The next time you are at cross purposes with one of your Blue Star Sisters, why don't you take the time to remember the relationship that makes you her sister; think about her and pray for her; write her a card, ask about her son's deployment; call her and talk about her daughter coming home from Japan; or stop by to visit when her grandchildren are in town (if you live close enough). Remember, we are sisters first.

As I was writing this article, I came home from work to receive a hand-written card from one of my Blue Star Sisters in another State. She, and several BSMs from her chapter, had written me the sweetest note of encouragement. And I sat on the couch and got teary-eyed. Yes, it came by snail mail, took days to get here, but when it arrived it struck me like an arrow hitting the bulls-eye on a target. I will keep it long after my term as National President is over. It was personal and it was tender, and it reinforced the very thing that had prompted me to write this note: we are sisters first. Let's finish this year with that thought in mind

FINAL NOTE: our Quarter-Century Sister (Mary) Mollie Tinapple(of Columbus Ohio) died last month in Florida. She had been a Blue Star Mother for more than 50 consecutive years. Good bye, Miss Mollie, and may God bless your memory as a Blue Star Mother.

Dear Blue Star Moms & Dads

I have learned a lot from asking and reading about H.R. 2647 in civilian words the Absentee Ballot for your Military son or daughter giving the power of voting.

Guidelines:

1. Have them contact their "Election Officer" in the military
2. They need to register with their "HOME" election board and request an application to receive an absentee ballot. That request is only good for (1) calendar year..... example: soldier request a ballot for the Spring Elections that request and address is good till December 31, 2012 end of calendar year !
3. When they receive the ballot they can request it go by email or mail (I suggest email !)
4. Complete the entire ballot and answer all questions..... it is paperwork !
5. The Ballot must be MAILED AND POSTMARKED BY MIDNIGHT THE NIGHT BEFORE ELECTION DAY !

THE NEW AMENDMENT did 2 things

- 1.) allowed a State to send a Ballot by email
- 2.) and placed the obligation of the VOTER to notify yearly his address to his local election board of course he must register with his election board.

Parents, guide your soldier to follow his right to vote. If he or she has done everything right and the voter feels he was excluded from the process; please call your local election board.

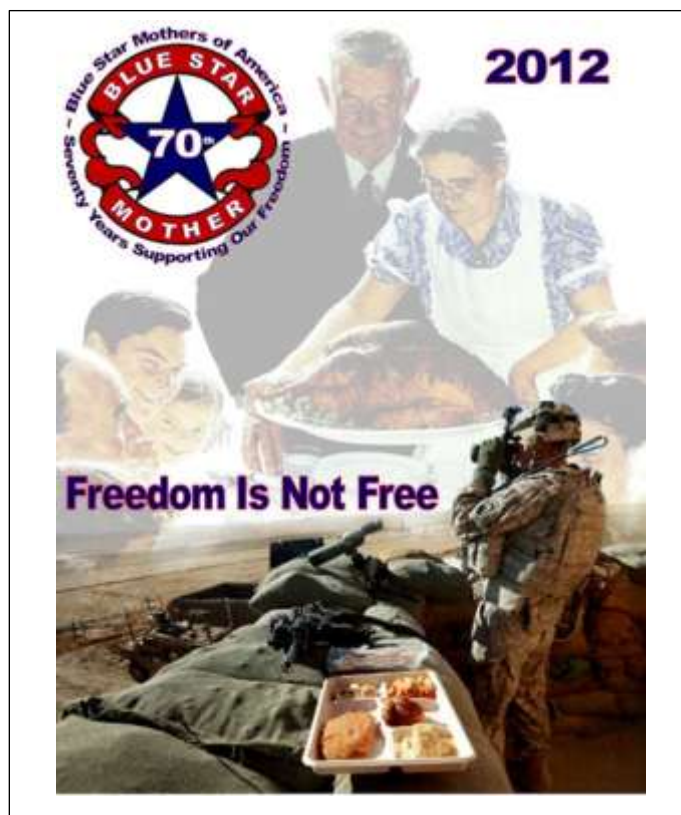

YEARBOOK PHOTO SUBMISSIONS

When submitting photos online for your online yearbook project, it's important to understand how to evaluate the quality of your digital image files. In general, what you see in respect to quality on a computer screen does not necessarily translate when you print a photo out. Submit high resolution photos to make sure your pages are designed without the "grainy-ness" that is attributed to printing low resolution images. The easiest way to tell if an image file is of high quality is to check the size of the file. The below guidelines are based on "KB" or kilobytes of data.

- If you're working with JPEG images, if you submit anything less than 100Kb, you're likely looking at a very low resolution file.
- Anything between 100KB and 300KB, you have some resolution in your file, but you will still likely notice some grainyness when the image is printed.
- If you're above 300KB on a JPEG image, then you're likely safe. Most digital cameras with 3 megapixels or more will always output a file above this range of data. If you have a 5 megapixel camera, which is the popular setting these days, you should see image file sizes above 1 megabyte.

### BSMA Governing Documents

Because the Governing Documents for Blue Star Mothers of America, Inc. are “living” documents, they have evolved year after year with become the guiding documents for the management of all Blue Star Mother of America Chapters throughout the country. Because these documents are “living” all members of Blue Star Mothers of America have been entrusted with the responsibility and the task to propose changes for our governing documents to be voted on each year at the BSMA National Convention.

We are now at the time of year to ask our membership to submit their proposed changes to our Governing Documents and we will be using the following guidelines for submitting a proposed change:

- Clearly state the Document, Article and Section in **Bold** print
- Write out the current statement and identify the portions to be changed in **Red**
- Rewrite the statement with proposed changes in **Blue**

If your submission does not following the above formatting, it may not be included as a change to be voted on during the 2012 National Convention Body.
