US Army Captain, George H. Maines, understanding what his mother had faced while he was serving his country, had the Flint News Advertiser place a coupon in their paper to see if there would be an interest in forming a military mothers support group.

On January 22, 1942 the coupon was printed and on the following February 1st, 300 mothers gathered at the Durant Hotel in Flint Michigan with Captain Maines chairing the meeting. With 1000 responses having come from the 'coupon ad', it was decided to form a permanent organization.

On February 6th the organization was reported on Congressional record and Chapters began to form in Michigan, Ohio, Wisconsin, New York, Pennsylvania, Oregon, California, Iowa and Washington.

On July 14, 1960 the Blue Star Mothers of America, Inc. was chartered by the US Congress as a Veterans Service Organization.

Mothers had volunteered throughout the tough times of World War II, serving in hospitals and train stations, packing care packages for soldiers, and working as part of homeland security. The organization has waned now and then in size over the years, but has always been held together by mothers who had great pride in both their children and their country.

Most recently the organization has had tremendous growth. With our country being attacked on our own soil, mothers have once again started hanging flags in their windows, proclaiming the pride they have in their children who are protecting our freedom during a time of war.

The Blue Star Mothers of America provides support for active duty service personnel, our military, our veterans, their families, and the families of the fallen; promotes patriotism and Americanism; assists the VA and Veterans organizations; and are available to assist in homeland volunteer efforts to help our country remain strong

- a) to support the Armed Forces of the United States of America and its Veterans;

- d) to educate our members and others not to divulge military or other government information;
- e) to assist and participate in ceremonies which honor, remember and support our military men and women, and Veterans;
- f) to honor those families whose children have died in service to our country;
- g) to assist in the care of unsupported mothers who gave their children to the service of the Nation;
- h) to foster true democracy;
- i) to assist in Homeland Security;
- to uphold the American principles of freedom, justice and equal rights, and to defend the United States from all enemies, foreign and domestic.

Turn back the clock to Nov. 29: The Blue Star Mothers' local chapter and VFW Post 6008 needed about \$4,000 to mail off care packages, cards and notes that we had collected for our troops abroad. Neither group had the funds.

Something had to be done and done quickly.

That's when countless Central Texans stepped up. Magical things happened.

The next day, a news crew from KWTX-TV visited my classroom at Tennyson Middle School to talk with students. As it is written, sometimes it is that little children lead the way. The kids on the evening news that night talked of the importance to our troops of gifts and messages from home. The Tribune Herald ran an editorial the next day summoning help. And KXXV-TV kept the story going. The message was clear: Troops would not get Christmas packages without the community's help.

At about 10:30 that first night, I got a Facebook message from a fellow teacher who is part of a VFW motorcycle group from Gatesville. Riders there pledged \$1,000. The next day, a sweet couple from Speegleville drove into town and dropped off a substantial check. A man who donated the first \$20 during our 2006 effort to send care packages came by this time with a big hug and a bigger check.

For the next three days, people of every stripe and color came by VFW Post 6008 and Poppa Rollo's Pizza and gave what they could so our troops would not be left out come Christmas morning.

A friend of mine recently laid off from her job came up to me and handed me money. Through my tears, I looked at her hard. I asked her if she was sure. Her voice broke a little as she told me that she wished she had more. In that moment she redefined generosity and selfless giving. Countless others who left no name gave from that place deep in the heart.

In two days, Tennyson students organized a fundraiser, garnering \$323. Students at China Spring ISD collected money. They brought a huge bag of change and bills totalling over \$200. Woody's Wrecker Service gave a significant donation.

The second day, Claude Ervin of Waco Scottish Rite Bodies called and made a proposal. He said that if we could raise the first half needed, his organization would match it. By Thursday, less than 48 hours after the news got out, we counted what we had. I called Mr. Ervin. Thanks to the Scottish Rite and the kind folks of Central Texas, we knew the troops would have their Christmas after all.

We are now busy writing thank-you notes for all those who gave checks or left names. But so many of you left cash; we'll never know who you are. We hope that you read this and know how important your donation was, no matter how large or small. From the little kid with pennies, nickels, dimes and quarters to the grand men of the Scottish Rite, and everyone in between, the thanks of thousands of soldiers, sailors, airmen and Marines go out to you.

One thing is sure. Something very special happened in Central Texas those three days in early December. In a time of deep economic recession and tremendous anxiety, people who we will never know stepped up to help people they will probably never meet.

Some of you may have been that lonely soldier at Christmas long ago. Some of you may have had an empty place at the table on Christmas morning. Whoever you are, allow me to convey the thanks of many a tired and lonely service person who will spend this holiday ever vigilant, watching and waiting, making sure that the world we wake up in is safe and secure. Take a moment and remember all those serving. Say a prayer for their families and loved ones back home. Join us in a prayer for peace this Christmas Day.

While our chapter is small in number we have had a very busy busy year. We began with all the ceremonies for remembering September 11. We were present at the Beirut Memorial Service and dedication of the Gold Star Mothers Memorial at the Coastal Carolina Veterans Cemetery.

We have been busy making neck coolers for our many Marines and Sailors leaving Eastern North Carolina from Camp LeJeune, New River Marine Corps Air Station, and Cherry Point Marine Corps Air Station. We lost count at 3,500. Quilts for the Wounded Warriors at Portsmouth, Virginia, North Carolina Camp LeJeune, and Bethesda Hospital. It's hard but we also make quilts for the Fallen Heroes families of North Carolina.

Peggy Eckenrode and Sharon Dudley both helped with the 9/11 Run for the Tunnel in Jacksonville this year. We handed water to the runners and helped with set up/break down after the run. This was a first time event for Jacksonville Community. We also attended the Ringing of the Bells and the city celebration of the survival of American on Sept. 11, 2011.

We have attended and assisted with Veterans Day celebrations, USO Cookie Drop, Thanksgiving and Christmas Day dinners for our Active duty and Veterans. Over 2,000 meals are served at Thanksgiving and Christmas. We enlisted the help of one of the middle schools in Jacksonville and gave every bag of cookies handed out a card of thanks from the teens.

We helped with Wreaths Across America and even set our own wreath in the ceremony. We were pictured in the newspaper at that event and at the Veterans Day ceremony at the Disabled American Veterans lodge in Jacksonville.

Our Moms and Dads decorated my pickup truck with all the flags, signs of support and featured a real live Desert Storm Veteran (one of our Dad Associate members, David Moore, husband of Denise Moore. Denise is our secretary) in the Jacksonville Veterans Parade. This coming year we hope to have a trailer to be able to feature more of the Veterans in Jacksonville.

Our chapter had a Wounded Warrior ceremony and presented quilts to one of the local Marine Corps Battalions in August. 30 quilts have been handed out to Veterans and we were featured in an article of the National Wounded Warriors Association.

We continue to support our own treasurer's son in his efforts to become an Olympic competitor. Kirsta was able to organize and have 50 quilts presented to the competitors headquartered at the Wounded Warrior Regiment Quantico, Virginia. Kirsta Meadows is our chapter treasurer, membership chair, and owns her own quilting shop which is our local authorized Wounded Warrior Quilt distributor. She is an instructor in quilting at our local community college, as well, and has traveled to Colorado and other locations to see her son compete in the Olympic trials.

We have another mother, Toni Grimsey, that works with the students in one of our local middle schools. Dixon Middle Military Group is open to all students who have any type of affiliation with any branch of the military. We meet at least four times a month. Currently, the group is working on St. Patrick's Day cards for troops deployed. Our Military group has sent since August 5 packages for troops and 3 packages for the MP dogs in Afghanistan. Our group is still working on collecting items for the MP dogs. They also have done Veteran Day Cards for deployed troops and cards and posters for 7 staff members who are Veterans. We have done 100's of cards for Thanksgiving, Christmas and Valentine's Day for the deployed troops. We will continue to do Easter Cards before we are out of school for this year. The meetings are a way for students to talk and form bonds of support for the times when a loved one is away. We have many students who have a parent deployed or going to deploy or have just returned.

Our Chapter continues to reach out through the USO, local bases, Naval Hospital, Wounded Warrior Barracks, and Fisher House. We continue to attend and have become formal member of the local Onslow County Veterans Council Association. We have churches, other Veteran Groups, and citizens that help in all our efforts.

WOUNDED WARRIOR

Our son, Sqt. Thomas Shepard, deployed to Afghanistan in March 2011 as a sniper team leader for the 10^{th} Mountain Division. He had just finished qualification for Special Forces and was looking forward to school upon his return. But, on July 16th our lives changed forever. We received the call from our daughter-in-law, Brandy, that Tom had been severely injured while setting up a sniper outpost. An IED had exploded under his feet and he had lost his left leg. He was taken to Kandahar then on to Landstuhl , Germany. He was soon, flown to Walter Reed July 19th and joined the warriors on Ward 57. We drove to D.C. to be with him, his wife, and little girl...remaining there for 3 months taking care of our grand daughter (age 2) and helping Brandy in any way we could. By the end of October and after about 18 surgeries, he was put on outpatient status and rehab began. His right leg was seriously injured as well but doctors were able to salvage it. We were so happy to have them home for Christmas and to be with them in Colorado for a week of skiing. Yes, he's skiing again thanks to the Vail Veterans Program which sponsored 19 wounded warriors in a one-week ski program. We can't thank those who donated funds, time, and resources to make this possible.

We have learned many things through the last 6 months. Our eyes were opened to the horrors of war, and how, it affects our soldiers. I wish everyone could visit Walter Reed and experience the courage and determination of our brave young warriors. We have learned to trust deeper and pray harder. We have learned to thank God in all circumstances and expect great things from Him in the future. We have learned not to dwell on the past, or what could have been, and that our plans aren't always His. Though we can't see the big picture, we know that our God is faithful....no matter what. Thank you for your prayers for us, for our brave warriors, and for their families.

- Rewrite the statement with proposed changes in Blue

If your submission does not following the above formatting, it may not be included as a change to be voted on during the 2012 National Convention Body.

Department of Ohio February 2012 Report

Dept. of Ohio Conference call was held 2/15/12 and 8 chapters were represented, which is the most this year!

The CareSource grants were distributed to 8 chapters. A letter and check was sent to the chapter president, which included a contract that must be signed and returned to the Dept of Ohio. The 8 Chapters have until 8/1/12 to use the money as requested. CareSource along with all the Ohio Chapter presidents, were notified as to how this \$10,000 was distributed.

Sally Botson will be the Dept. of Ohio pro-tem recording secretary. Barb Funk resigned due to too many outside and work commitments.

The Dept. of Ohio has changed the date for its convention from September to November 2-4 and will be in Columbus, Ohio. This was necessary due to chapter and elected board conflicts in September and October.

The working balance for the Dept of Ohio as of 2/15/12 is \$8568, which includes \$1,412 from a chapter that recently closed.

We are currently working on the Dept of Ohio North/South education seminar that will be held 4/28/12 (Saturday) in Columbus. The elected board will meet in person on 3/31/12 to go over the presentation.

The necklace fundraiser (enamel service flag) for the Dept. of Ohio will need to be replaced. The jeweler no longer wishes to make these necklaces unless we order at least 20 each time. This is not realistic for us to comply with so we will complete this last order and suspend the fundraiser.
